## SOUND MMMMMMMFOR ONLINE VIDEO



Clear, high-quality audio ensures that your students easily understand what you are saying and helps them grasp concepts without having to mentally filter out noise. Here are a few sound tips to improve the audio quality of your recordings.

- Take a moment to close your eyes and listen to the other sounds in the room. Air conditioners, fridges, and hallway traffic mean you probably need to find a differet space to record.
- Use a separate microphone rather than the one built into the computer. A microphone made for desktop recording or podcasting will help isolate your voice from other sounds in the room.
- Minimize echos by adding a blanket to your desk and placing tall plants in the corners of the room.
- Check your sound quality by recording a test and listening back with headphones.
  Listen for echos and spots where audio is distorted.
